Introduction

How to Identify Members

- BlueCard® members have a three-character alpha prefix at the beginning of their ID number. **The alpha prefix is key to facilitating prompt payment.**
- The member ID is a combination of alpha and numeric characters.

Important Facts About the Alpha Prefix

- Do not assume that the member's ID number is the Social Security number. Many plans have re-issued ID cards with a different ID number.
- Be sure that all of your systems and upgrades accommodate a correct member ID, which may include both alphabetic and/or numeric characters following the 3 letter alpha prefix. Note too that while many ID numbers may be fewer than 17 characters, all will have an alpha prefix .
- Do not add or delete characters or numbers within the member ID
- Do not change the sequence of the characters following the alpha prefix.
- Please make copies of the front and back of the ID card, and pass this information to your billing staff.

BlueCard

- Identify by the three-digit alpha prefix in front of ID number and an empty suitcase or “PPO in a suitcase” logo
- The member may be covered through another Blue Cross and/or Blue Shield Plan
