Prior Authorization – Ensures appropriate use of drugs by requiring preapproval to verify appropriate prescribing.



Quantity Limits – Restricts the amount of drugs that a member may receive during a prescribing period. Limits promote safe, cost-effective drug use reducing waste and overuse.



Step Therapy – Requires members to try a safe, more clinically effective, and in some cases less expensive drug, before they are approved for a more expensive drug.

PHARMACY UTILIZATION MANAGEMENT Q1 2019 Updates

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Utilization Management includes:

Prior Authorizations – Ensures appropriate use of drugs by requiring pre-approval to verify appropriate prescribing.

Quantity Limits – Restricts the amount of drugs that a member may receive during a prescribing period. Limits promote safe, cost-effective drug use. They also help reduce waste and overuse.

Step Therapy – Requires members to try a safe, more clinically effective and in some cases less expensive drugs, before they are approved for a more expensive drug.

The following are recent changes to the programs.1

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2019

New Programs

Lucemyra – a medication that manages the symptoms of opioid withdrawal after abrupt discontinuation in adults.

- Prior Authorization to ensure safe and appropriate use
- Quantity Limits to manage appropriate quantities and dose

Pseudobulbar Affect – inappropriate involuntary laughing and crying due to a nervous system disorder.

- Prior Authorization to ensure appropriate use of Nudexta
- Quantity limits to manage appropriate quantities and dose of Nudexta

Topiramate Extended Release (ER) – a medication that is used to treat seizure disorders.

- → Prior Authorization to ensure safe and appropriate use of Trokendi XR and Qudexy XR
- Quantity Limits to manage appropriate quantities and dose of Trokendi XR and Qudexy XR

Changes to Utilization Management Programs

Antiretroviral Agents – a group of medications that can prevent the growth of a virus.

 Quantity Limits – to target Delstrigo, Pifeltro, Symtuza and nevirapine (new generic for Viramune)

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) – a brain disorder that results in inattentiveness or hyperactivity.

 Quantity Limits – to target amphetamine tablet (new generic for Evekeo)

Atypical Antipsychotic Agents – a group of antipsychotic medications used to treat psychiatric conditions.

- Step Therapy to target Perseris
- Quantity Limits to manage safe and appropriate use of Perseris

Doxycycline & Minocycline – antibiotics that are used to treat bacterial infections.

- Prior Authorization for use of Minolira ER
- Quantity Limits to target Minolira ER

Migraine – a headache of varying intensity, often accompanied by nausea and sensitivity to light and sound.

- Prior Authorization for use of Ajovy
- Quantity Limits to target Ajovy

Mulpleta – used to treat thrombocytopenia, a deficiency of platelets in the blood, in adult patients with chronic liver disease prior to a procedure.

- Prior Authorization for use of Mulpleta
- Quantity Limits to target Mulpleta

Multiple Sclerosis – a disease in which the immune system eats away at the protective covering of nerves.

- → Prior Authorization for use of dalfampridine (new generic for Amypra)
- Quantity Limits to target dalfampridine (new generic for Amypra)

Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension – a type of high blood pressure that affects arteries in the lungs and in the heart.

- Prior Authorization for use of tadalafil (new generic for Adcirca)
- Quantity Limits to target tadalafil (new generic for Adcirca)

Self-administered Oncology Agents – a group of medicines to treat cancer that are a tablet or capsule form and can be taken by mouth.

- Prior Authorization for use of Copiktra and Tibsovo
- → Quantity Limits to target Copiktra and Tibsovo

Topical lidocaine – medication that is used on the skin to reduce pain or discomfort caused by skin irritations or nerve pain.

- Prior Authorization for use of ZTLido Pad
- Quantity Limits to target ZTLido Pad

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Unless otherwise noted, prior authorization and quantity limit programs apply to both brand and generic drugs.
